TEACHINGS – HAZRAT INAYAT KHAN

Vol I – Part I: Sufi Thoughts (viii)

There is One Object of Praise, the beauty which uplifts the heart of its worshippers through all aspects from the seen to the unseen.'

It is said in the Hadith, 'God is beautiful, and He loves beauty.'

This expresses the truth that the human, who inherits the Spirit of God, has beauty in him/her and loves beauty, although that which is beautiful to one is not beautiful to another. One cultivates the sense of beauty as one evolves, and prefers the higher aspect of beauty to the lower. But when one has observed the highest vision of beauty in the Unseen by a gradual evolution from praising the beauty in the seen world, then the entire existence becomes to one, a single vision of beauty.

Humanity has worshipped God, beholding the beauty of sun, moon, stars, and planets. Humanity has worshipped God in plants, in animals. Humanity has recognized God in the beautiful merits of the human being, and one has with one's perfect view of beauty found the source of all beauty in the Unseen, from whence all this springs, and in Whom all is merged.

The Sufi, realizing this, worships beauty in all its aspects, and sees the face of the Beloved in all that is seen and the Beloved's Spirit in the Unseen. So wherever one looks one's ideal of worship is before one. 'Everywhere I look, I see Thy winning face; everywhere I go, I arrive at Thy dwelling-place.'

Vol V– Part I: The Sufi Message of Spiritual Liberty

Beloved ones of God, you may belong to any race, cast, creed, or nation, still you are all impartially beloved by God. You may be a believer or an unbeliever in the supreme Being, but He cares not. His mercy and grace flow through all His powers, without distinction of friend or foe.

The divine light has shone upon the mineral and vegetable kingdoms; and there too it has shown its phenomena, although its full radiance has been reached only in humanity. It can be seen in the developed intelligence, and this can be observed in the cosmic system as well as in the mineral and vegetable kingdoms. It is the light of the sun which shines upon the moon and the planets; each star is but a reflection of the same light; thus, the whole cosmic system is illuminated by the sun alone.

In the jungle a troop of monkeys can be seen following the command of one among them. After he has jumped, they all jump. The foxes and dogs in the jungle have among them one who is most wary, who gives the alarm before every coming danger.

faculty of quidance, with the maturity of intelligence, fulfills the purpose of manifestation in the evolution of man.

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EARTH RITUAL - Wali Via (Dar-us-salam)

I'd like to share an example of a ritual ceremony that I have done many times, for many years, with farmers and other agriculturalists, across North America. I have done this with as few as 15 people and as many as 200. It has been used to close agricultural conferences and at gatherings on our farm.

I alter the form of this ceremony according to the size of the group and my inner guidance at the time, but the basic form remains the same. I frequently incorporate the Elemental breaths and the Ziraat Salutations to the Elements, though I don't mention their Sufi origin, so as not to disenfranchise anyone, out of respect.

I'd like to share this ritual with you as a guided meditation. You may wish to close your eyes and imagine you are gathered in a circle of people, in nature, or on a farm.

Each person is holding a handful of soil brought from their farms, gardens, or other places of significance to them. Imagine where you would have gathered your soil.

In the center of the circle is a beautiful bowl.

Look around you. Take in the beauty that surrounds you. Marvel in the miracle of being alive as a witness to, and part of all of this. Feel the breeze against your cheeks, the warmth of the Sun on your back. Listen to the sounds of Nature. Breathe in the presence of this place. Let us attune to the Elements with the breath and offer the Ziraat Salutations.

As people who work the land, we have a special connection with the soil. We understand that the soil we hold in our hands is a living miracle. That we are wholly dependent upon the soil, not only for our livelihoods, but for our very lives, as does all of Life. We, as people of the land, are entrusted with the care of the soil, for our society, and for the Earth. Just as the soil in our hands is connected, though our farms may be distant from each other, so are we connected in our purpose here today.

We must assume our roles as healers of the Earth. An Earth that has been degraded by human ignorance and greed. Take a few moments now in silence.

What do you wish for our planet? What is your prayer? As you do this, know that this wish, this prayer, has an immediate effect in the world, and also imbues the soil you hold.

Now one by one, step forward and place your soil in the bowl in the center of the circle.

As each person walks forward in turn, see them as fellow healers of the Earth.

I then ask for two volunteers, one an elder, and one of young age, to come to the center and mix the soil together. Then, they carry the bowl around the circle and each person takes a handful of soil.

Now, each person symbolically holds the wishes and prayers of everyone here and this signifies that the healing that is needed on the planet today will take all of us working together and supporting one another.

Now, you notice that there remains a little soil in the bowl. (This happens every time I have done this ritual.) It is because you are givers, not takers. Now take this soil back to your farm, garden, yard, or other place of significance, and offer it back with the wishes and prayers of us all.

May the work of all our hands be blessed!

Prayer for the Planet – (Healing and Universal Worship)




May we develop a covenant of self-sacrifice so that we join in unity to realize and live the principles of love, harmony, beauty and peace. Amen
