



## From Jamia Haqq:

We have just celebrated the **Rise of Matariki** here in Aotearoa, New Zealand, otherwise known as the Pleiades. It is known to be, our New Year, and is celebrated throughout our country, and has been a National holiday, in the last 3 years. This time is for Reflection of family and community, and certainly a celebration of Ziraat, Honouring Nature, in every form.

- One of the Stars, Pohutakawa is to Remember, those who have passed in the last year.
- The Last of the Stars, we get to Make a Wish, for the coming year. For me, It would be, World Peace.

#### From Wali:

I was at 65 degrees latitude on the Solstice in the Yukon Territory of Canada. No night at all. I could see colors for all 24 hours, though the light dimmed for a couple of hours. It was a bit disconcerting for someone who generally goes to bed with the sun and rises with it on the Summer Solstice.

#### From Nehmat:

I'm also feeling a little topsy-turvey with the seasons and solstice attunement at the moment, as I'm travelling in Europe. I'm used to the June solstice in winter and as Jamia Haqq described - it's usually a jemali time of quiet reflection and introspection - akin to garnering in the **Cycle of Work on the Farm** and looking to what lies ahead and perhaps setting new intentions and goals. In contrast for those in North America and Europe - it's the summer solstice and life is in full swing, it's mid-way through the cycle of work on the farm. Gardens are flourishing, fields prepared, crops sown and growing well. Harvest time is approaching, if not already begun and this is a jelali time – full of energy and productivity.

I've been trying to find a word that describes a universally shared experience at this time of year when we are seeing and experiencing the light of the sun from opposite perspectives. I've settled with *Ishq*, that mysterious aspect of love - that exists both in presence and absence, the nostalgic remembering and longing for the light and love that both enlivens and unites us all - no matter where we live.

## Symbology of the Plough (Link)

"The plough is symbolic of prana, breath" and "The plough itself represents the human being"

Murshid also writes about *Jelali* and *Jemali* aspects of breath and the need for them both to be working together to achieve harmony and balance of life.

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## **ZIRAAT GROUPS AND LODGES**

In alignment with Pir Zia's vision of a more inter-connected global Inayatiyya, we are fostering international friendships and networks within the Ziraat Activity. For the Rewilding program earlier this year 17% of people who registered were from Europe/East Asia and 14% from Oceania and individuals from Japan, Greece, Portugal, Turkey.

## Ziraat Activities in Europe

## From Raqib - Gerhad Kittel

In 2024/25, many activities in Europe focussed on the history of the regions, the Celts, the annual festivals and humanism. Seminars, excursions and working groups took place. We welcome the new Ziraat members in Pakistan and Turkiye.

One of Pir Zia's particular suggestions is that a Ziraát Lodge should be held at the source of the Danube (Europe's second longest river). My idea is that Ziraát lodges, healing circles, music and church services are held on the same day in all countries at places of water (rivers, lakes, seas). (Actually, every tap connects us universally through this element).

- There would be no central event/transmission, just a list on which all participating places are noted (except Pir Zia would come to the Danube).
- It would be a wave of water that would travel from place to place, from continent to continent, around the world on that day.
- Water, the element of balance, of justice, which is so much in need.
- A suitable date would be, for example, the equinox, 20/21 September 2025, one week before the
  feast of St Michael, who is also dedicated to Demeter and agriculture and thus to Ziraát, two weeks
  before the harvest thanksgiving festival.

## From Tasnim - Lejla Stupac

I've just been on a retreat in the mountains. Nature here in the Alps is very challenged at the moment with the hot temperatures. The climate change is very noticeable here. The intense heat was followed by a lot of rain and the earth slid down and blocked the roads and tracks...

I pray that the elements will come into balance and harmony.

Here's a summary of some of the recent Ziraat offerings across different countries here in Europe:

- in Austria, Salima organized dances and peace prayers at the source of the Drau River in June, offering the prayers in the languages of the peoples living along the course of the river;
- in Belgium and Netherlands, the solstice was celebrated. MehrunNisa is organising gatherings (lodges). These are halfday-workshops and national friendship days, focusing on deepening the cultivation of the heart, using symbols from nature. In addition, she is giving seasonal Nature Meditations (at the beginning of winter, spring, summer, autumn), eventually with a ritual, preferably taking place outdoors.
- in France, the one-year meeting of Ziraat and chivalry took place on June 21 & Fazl Mai is regularly publishing her newsletter which is translated in English and German.
- in Germany, Safed since June has started an online class once a month to open the field for the archetype of Mary Magdalene and Raqib is working on his multi-national "Water Wave" project. There is a monthly new moon group with Beate.
- in UK, Amina is offering a monthly Ziraat Gathering.
- in Switzerland, KarimRafi is offering Ziraat-days 4 times a year. Together with MehrunNisa, we have leading an Emerald Contemplations group via zoom. It is an international group.
